CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Trustee Goebel at 9:00 a.m.

WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS

The meeting began with the singing of 'O Canada' followed by a welcome to the committee by Trustee Goebel. Trustees and Senior Executive were introduced. Associate Ben Beil provided information of the purpose of the Student Advisory Committee and talked about the role of the Co-chair position that would be voted on later in the meeting.

TECHNOLOGY INTEGRATION – VISIONING EXERCISE

Associate Superintendent Beil led the students in a session on technology integration. Parkland School Division is working with stakeholders to gather information on the role of technology in schools today, how it affects and supports learning.

Students were asked for input on five questions:

1. How has the use of technology affected your learning?
2. In what circumstances is it most helpful to use technology to support your learning? What technology would have top priority for you in learning?
3. What are the challenges or obstacles to overcome as we move forward in increasing the integration of technology use to support learning?
4. What do you want to see in technology integration to support your learning that you do not have now?
5. Is access to the internet in rural areas an issue?

Group discussions took place on each of the questions and comments from each group were recorded. The summary will be submitted to Learning Services as part of their collection of data.

ECONOMIC STRATEGY PRESENTATION

Jay Northcott and Christie Kobialko from Spruce Grove High School and Matthew Ready from Memorial did a presentation on their experiences while attending the Economic Strategy Session hosted by Premier Stelmach in Calgary. Students from all over Alberta attended the session to provide input on questions about the Alberta economy in the future. Three key questions that the students were asked were:

What are we seeing today in Alberta economy?

What do we want to see in Alberta economy in 50 years?

How do we get there?

The group answered questions from the audience.

CO-CHAIRPERSON NOMINATION

Students from the following schools were nominated for the Student Advisory Co-Chair position: Spruce Gove Composite and Blueberry.

Each nominee spoke to voters on why they should be elected as Co-Chair.

Votes were tallied, and the Co-Chair for the 2010-2011 Student Advisory Committee will be Christie Kobailko from Spruce Grove Composite High School.
